In Design and Technology, Room 9 students have brought their childhood experiences to life in creating their very own live arcade games from recycled materials. A strong emphasis for assessment was placed on careful selection of joining techniques. All students showed total engagement in this, and the ideas that came to life were super impressive! The projects were recently showcased to Mrs. Vogelsang's Room 2 class, who were invited to experience the arcade and interact with the Room 9 students in an enjoyable and memorable afternoon. Room 8

Throughout the term Room 8 have been using Blooms Taxonomy to incorporate Mathematics, (measurement, volume, area and capacity), with Design & Technology and Literacy.

The task was to design, apply set criteria, analyse, create and evaluate hand sewn cushions.

Students were asked to list the steps, processes, equipment required and write a detailed procedural text for making their cushion. They then had to ensure correct techniques of measurement conversion and apply these to cut, trim, pin and stitch their fabric into cushions.

Our students thoroughly enjoyed the task and have learnt a valuable skill along the way, practicing their running and back stitch to create the cushion, whilst improving their patience and resilience to stitch carefully and correctly.
