Dear parents/caregivers,

Every year, usually as the seasons change, new school uniforms are in high demand.

The most common reasons for increased need are:

- children grow quickly, outgrowing the winter/summer uniform
- in winter, clothes take longer to dry
- children have misplaced their school uniform
- children have had so much fun they've ripped holes in their uniforms

To support families:

- spare tops/jackets are available in the front office and children are asked to 'swap' their non uniform for school uniform discreetly at the beginning of the day.
- if parents/caregivers write a note in a child's diary explaining why they aren't wearing school uniform on a given day, we endeavor to let all educators know so the child isn't asked to swap them
- we offer financial aid through Anglicare to purchase uniforms
- we offer preloved uniforms thanks to the generosity of families

Other news:

Wednesday, week 10, children will be coming home with their report cards for semester one. They differ from previous years in that there is one general comment that teachers have written in relation each child's dispositions/traits for learning. Please refer to the cover letter inside the report card for further explanation.

In week 7 of term 3, more educators will be attending the next Prospect North conference, along with our learner leaders.
