Dear Parents/Caregivers,

We have headed into our final term for the year at full steam ahead, with a lot of planning already in place for 2025. In my Principal section of each newsletter I will update our caregivers and wider community about our ongoing work in implementing our Site Learning Plan. Last term, learners that attended Prospect North Primary for a 'Kids Talk Agency' conference participated in an activity which focused on auditing the notion of 'Activating Learner Voice to accelerate learning improvement'. Learners were supported to create a list of ideas under the headings of 'Not Yet Evident', 'Worth Exploring', 'Developing' and 'This is a Strength'. This task was also completed by Educators and Governing Council this week. Please see page two for a further break down of the task and next steps forward.

As a site that takes pride in connecting to our community, we have a number of events this term focusing on 'connecting to community' through opening up our doors to other sites along with fundraising for a 'person' entry gate on Stirling street, sidsandkidsSA and supporting our first Year 6 Graduation to be held at the Ale House in Wallaroo. Although we have the required amount of gates, our community has spoken and we have listened. We are now looking at the whole area along Stirling Street and opportunities to develop an outside learning space. We are hosting the last Partnership Day where leaders from Yorke Peninsula Preschools, Primary Schools, High Schools and Area Schools are attending a 'Leaders Day' in our gym. Leaders will be provided with the opportunity to see how staff, learners and families at WPS implement the Department for Education strategy along with our Site Learning Plan (see page 2). Leaders will also be provided the opportunity to walk through our learning spaces and see first hand, the line of sight between our WPS Learning Plan and Educator planning along with children's work.

A focus for our staff professional development over the past two years has been planning and programming that includes a strong focus on mathematics that can be connected across the curriculum. When we refer to the application of mathematics in context and the dispositions required to apply it, we call it 'Numeracy'. This week in the yard, we saw numeracy in action. Learners playing with a tyre predicted how many 'flips' it would take to move the tyre from the hills to the opposite fenceline. There was a prediction, a discussion about being consistent with the way the tyre was flipped (and why this is important to control), with lots of exercise and fun along the way. The child that predicted 50 flips was so close! It was 55 flips! Images of this work below.



Above: Our WPS Learning Plan - Activating learner voice to accelerate learning improvement. The above is an example of how we involve children and their families in goal setting. By looking at the strengths columns we can then make decisions about next steps eg Learners placed 'students discuss how everyone can challenge themselves in new learning': this provides educators with the knowledge to provide opportunities for and seek evidence for the disposition of persistence when faced with difficult tasks and strategies for when learners are not sure what to do. Educators placed 'students give feedback to their peers and teachers' in the 'strength' column, leading to educators being able to share examples with peers, learners and families where feedback has been sought and provided, examples including videos, displayed work, the sharing of learning with the aim for feedback to improve. Governing Council (GC) placed 'Students get feedback and use it to move their learning forward' as a strength, which provides educators with the information that what they are intending in their planning is having the intended impact. Noting the aspects GC have put in the 'not yet evident' column, it was discussed that the aspects may be present but there is more as a site we can do, in sharing with families to raise awareness.



Connections between Art, Design, Mathematics and Technology







In Semester 2, WPS learners are exploring connections between Art, Design, Mathematics, and Digital Technology. We began by studying Islamic Girih tiles, creating infinite geometric patterns using five tile types.

Next, learners explored printmaking, designing their own prints with careful consideration of shapes and overall visual impact. Mathematical reasoning, critical thinking, and problem-solving were essential as they navigated concepts like repetition, mirroring, spatial awareness, tessellation, and transformation. Art elements, including positive and negative space, shape, and form, were also emphasized.

We contrasted this with monoprinting, a unique, single-use process using foil, water, and paint to create beautiful cards. This week, learners dive into digital technology, exploring how digital images are created and printed. They've been introduced to pixels, coding, RGB color, and concepts like DPI and resolution.

To conclude the term, students will create pixel art images using mosaic paper for display in Room 7. It's exciting to see their journey come full circle Mrs. Williamson

Dear families,

Transition to school for children moving from Wallaroo Preschool to Wallaroo Primary begin next week, week 4 on Tuesday 5th November.

All transition dates are:

Due to one of our future learners being highly allergicanaphylactic (could die if touches nuts), we ask that all families and staff across the school R-6 treat WPS as a 'NUT FREE ZONE' for the above dates.

As an inclusive school for all children, we will move towards a 'Nut' guideline from 2025 that will support the safety of the child with this severe allergy. This guideline will not impact what we do at WPS, just the way we do it eg focus on hand hygiene before and after eating, lunchbox foods, cooking sessions etc. We will be working with the family and the Australasian Society of Clinical Immunology and Allergy (ASCIA) which is the website that all schools refer to when developing guidelines to keep children safe.
