What amazing learning we've had at Wallaroo Primary School. Learners in Years 3 to 6 have had the opportunity to attend an overnight camp at Monarto Zoo, outside Murray Bridge. The camp was completely funded by Adelaide University and ZoosSA. How did we get so lucky? Through our ongoing work with Children's University, offering engaging learning opportunities both in and out of school hours and supporting our families to extend all children to love learning, that's how. This year we have many 'Lunch Clubs'. These are extra opportunities for children to opt into learning, that are all led by educators and volunteers in their own time. Why? because we believe in building the 'love of learning' wherever we can.

This year, Belinda Williamson, as part of her Extension Leader role is creating slide shows for all classes to access each morning, that highlight 'what to expect' over the day/week, a 'class designed' Acknowledgment of Country, reminders, facts and links to support the building of our knowledge and connection to country, continuing our steps towards reconciliation and togetherness across the school. Authentically seeking connections to build understanding of the Narungga culture, language, people and country is at the forefront of all our decisions within classes and across the school. Our sports teams 'Wildu' (Sea Eagle) and 'Widhadha' (Shark) for the second year have t-shirts that our learners can purchase to wear for Sports Days and PE days. Our year 6 learners are looking to include more Narungga symbols and gain the support of a local artist, to support the designing of this year's Year 6 tops.

I'd like to thank and acknowledge the support of our parents/caregivers at supporting so many of our learners to be ready for and attend the camp. Huge thank you to our educators for attending camp, staying overnight and for embracing the special moments such an experience has brought to so many. Term 2


Room 3 - Continuing to explore the elements of music through songs, games and rhymes (recognising rhythms and pitch, and keeping the beat in our feet).

Studio Inspire - PianoPhonics, composition with Xylophones, Djembes, and Bucket Drums, and songwriting to communicate messages of sustainability.
















































Monarto Safari Park 3-6 Camp Learner Comments
